Exposure to domestic violence or family substance abuse also increases the likelihood of juvenile crime. 2. Socioeconomic Conditions Poverty and economic hardship: Youth from low-income families may turn to crime out of economic necessity or as a result of limited resources and opportunities. Lack of access to quality education, jobs, and extracurricular activities reduces protective factors that help prevent delinquent behavior. 3. Peer Influence and Gang Involvement Adolescents are highly influenced by peers. Associating with delinquent peers increases the risk of engaging in criminal activity. Gang membership offers a sense of identity and belonging, particularly in underserved communities, but significantly increases violent behavior and criminal acts. 4. Substance Use and Abuse Alcohol and drug use among teens is strongly associated with criminal behavior, including theft, assault, and vandalism. Substance abuse often co-occurs with mental health issues, compounding the risk of delinquency. 5. Mental Health and Trauma Undiagnosed or untreated mental health disorders, such as conduct disorder, depression, or PTSD, can contribute to aggressive or impulsive behaviors. Exposure to trauma (e.g., abuse, neglect, community violence) affects brain development and decisionmaking, increasing the risk of involvement in crime. 6. School Engagement and Performance Youth who struggle academically, are frequently suspended, or feel disconnected from school are more likely to commit crimes.
