# History of the organization




- Birmingham Talks (BT) was founded in 2019 by the City of Birmingham, Bloomberg
   Philanthropies, and The Overton Project.
- BT is the only program in the state offering an early literacy intervention that utilizes quantifiable data.
- After 3 years of proven results, Birmingham
   Talks is poised to significantly expand locally with strong support from Mayor Randall
   Woodfin and the City of Birmingham.



## Our big bet: investing in early IQ has life-time value




Babies need to hear roughly 21,000 words per day for optimal brain development. Many children who enter our program hear 4,000-6,000 words a day -- less than 50% of what they need to be ready for kindergarten, college, and the workforce.

# Start - an empowering parent program






Start is a 8- 10 week program for caregivers of children 4 months-4 years old. The program uses a combination of technology and coaching to impact early literacy and parent/child relationships.

#### **How LENA technology works**



LENA technology is the industry standard for measuring talk with children. LENA is comprised of technology,, curriculum, and coaching -- all of which helps adults make sustainable increases in interactive talk with children.



#### What kind of data does a LENA device generate?



# Start: 8-10 week program cycle









#### **COMMUNITY DEMAND**

Desire for programming is at an all time high. 400 children were on a waitlist for services this winter; 3 families raise hands for every 1 spot.



#### **COMMUNITY NEED**

92% of children start the program hearing < 21k words a day. 62% start the program hearing < 10k. Mayor Randall Woodfin is highly invested in early childhood education broadly and Birmingham Talks

specifically.

# Sample division of responsibilities





- Provides partners with recruitment fliers
- Provides consent forms to families
- Facilitates program sessions and individual coaching calls
- Provides all needed resources (technology, curriculum, family incentives, etc.)
- Manages device upload and disperses incentives for families
- Hosts graduation celebration for families

# Participating Partner Organization

- Shares program information with families via physical and/or digital means (fliers, social media, email, etc.)
- Encourages employees who have contact with families to to learn more about the program and assist with recruited families within their reach
- When appropriate, allows their physical location to be used as host site for groups during the cohort cycle
